How it works

A natural burial is the most ecological funeral option, a thoughtful legacy for future generations. The burial ground will become a thriving mature native woodland.

In advance

- Visit the burial ground and spend time there getting to know it and deciding whether it's right for you.
- Download an application form from our website, or phone us and we'll send you an information pack.
- Pre-purchase at today's rate. Options available to pay by standing order.

When planning a funeral

- Complete an interment form to let us know your plans for the day so that we can help you achieve your wishes.
- Make the arrangements yourself or ask your funeral director to do this for you.
- Book the date and time with us. Burials may take place 10am-3pm and at weekends by special arrangement.

Practicalities

We recommend stout footwear as the ground is uneven. A foldable chair is a good idea for those who find it difficult to stand and remember, there's no such thing as bad weather, just the wrong sort of clothes...

Flowers

Consider using flowers from your garden, or a friend's, or produce from the veg patch to create a hand-tied bouquet. Ask florists to use these or locally grown flowers. No plastic, Oasis foam or wire, please.

Think about scattering petals from a basket or single stems into the grave.

Pets

Dogs offer comfort and companionship, especially at funerals. Dogs on leads are welcome at the burial ground.

A pet's ashes may be included in its owners grave at the time of interment.

Creating a new native woodland

We are planting new native woodland across the areas where burials take place, so that one day this place will be a thriving mature woodland with open glades and rides, shrub margins and deeper woodland shade.

Tree planting began in 2011

Whips were planted in the winter in protective tubes fixed to sturdy stakes to give them the best chance for growth and survival. Since then, more shrubs and trees have been planted each winter. The pattern follows the design for the woodland so that a structured layout with paths, glades and vistas is created.

At 12 years old

Having grown out of their tubes, the trees now stand alone and begin to create the layered canopy which is essential for access to sunlight. The trees will be a mixture of native species including Oak, Cherry and Hazel and will eventually merge with the surrounding countryside.

Several years on

The young saplings found their way out of the protective tubes. These tubes help to protect from rabbit and deer damage while providing a microclimate perfect for young trees. The woodland is overplanted and inevitably some will fail and if appropriate some will be replaced.

50 years and beyond

By this stage the woodland will have matured and the layered canopy of trees and shrubs will support a stable ecosystem including spring flowering native plants, shrubs and an abundance of wildlife.





Memorial plaques

It's important to commemorate the names of the dead and when they lived. Unlike a conventional cemetery, there will not be rows of memorial stones, vases of flowers or mementos placed on each grave.

Instead, inside the burial ground among the woodland there is a solid oak-framed and chestnut-framed memorial panels where slate plaques are mounted.

Each plaque is inscribed with the name, year of birth and year of death of those buried here.

Finding the spot

To preserve the natural landscape, graves do not feature headstones, grave-markers or surrounds; instead, they are carefully mapped and their locations are recorded and shared with you so that you'll know where to visit.

Access: Open year-round. The pedestrian gate into the meadow is not

locked. The car park is kept locked – please call the office 01600

716438 for the code.

Please let wheelchair users know that there are no paths across

the grass.

Description: A beautiful developing woodland within the landscape of the

Chilterns Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty.

Ethos: Keep things simple, natural and sustainable. Real countryside

preserved for future generations.

On-site facilities: No rooms, chapels, toilets or mortuary facilities. Simply, car

parking, a bench and two solid chestnut memorial frames.

The nearest public WCs are at The Oast House car park.

Procedures

Provisional booking: Call 01600 716438 to make a provisional funeral booking, after the

death has been certified, and let us know the requested date, name of the deceased, your own contact details and any prior

purchase information.



Confirmation: We will check the calendar to make sure it's not already taken,

then contact the gravedigger and custodian to make sure they are

available before confirming the booking.

Submit forms: Download the <u>Interment Form</u> and complete the details as soon

as possible and <u>at least two days before the event</u>. Email it to <u>henley@leedam.com</u> with a scanned copy of the Coroner's Order for Burial or a Registrar's Certificate (or cremation certificate for

an ashes interment).

Payments: Payment by bank transfer is required before the event.

The gravedigger is paid separately, but also before the event. We will send you a receipt and confirm that everything is OK.

Embalming: Embalming fills the body with toxic chemicals which we do not

wish to introduce into the soil. We would only accept embalmed

remains in exceptional circumstances, e.g. repatriation.

Arranging a plot: Arrange a family visit to the burial ground with the Custodian

(01494 881586) who will show you the options available.

Liaise with the office directly (01600 716438) using the mobile app

What3Words.com to make sure the location is right.

Plots: Plots are single depth. We do not offer double plots, as developing

tree roots and canopy prevent new graves from being dug next to older ones, but we will offer the closest possible arrangement

when the time comes.

Coffins etc: Choose an eco-coffin, casket or shroud. All materials, including

linings and clothing, should be natural and biodegradable. No veneered MDF or chipboard, please. Standard nameplates are OK or a handwritten card label with the deceased's name and dates.

TIP - Use calico canvas instead of polythene Crem Film.

Coffin size: Please measure and include the true maximum external

dimensions of the coffin on the Interment Form. If in doubt,

please call us.



Grave digging: Our nominated gravedigger will prepare the grave ready for your

arrival. Graves are single depth 1.3m. Families can backfill the soil

to cover the coffin if they choose, but the gravedigger will

complete the work.

On the day: There will be only one burial on the day you have chosen. The

Custodian will be there to meet and direct you.

The vehicular gate into the meadow will be open for the hearse, limousine and family mourners with limited mobility who display

the priority parking sign in the windscreen.

TIP - Estate cars are popular with families instead of the formal hearse.

Dogs and pets: Dogs offer comfort and companionship, especially at funerals.

Dogs on leads are welcome at the burial meadow. A pet's ashes may be included in its owner's grave at the time of interment.

Music: There is no electrical power supply in the burial ground. Make sure

that battery-powered speakers are powerful enough to deliver good sound quality. Live, acoustic music is always beautiful.

What to wear: Wellies/hiking shoes (not high-heels); warm, windproof clothes.

TIP - Bring folding chairs, scarves, hats and blankets for the elderly.

Carrying the coffin: The ground is uneven, so the usual church trolley might struggle.

Carry the coffin underarm rather than on shoulders, feet-first. Set up trestles at regular resting points if the carry distance is long.

Webbing: Funeral Directors - please bring your own webbing. The custodian

or gravedigger will have a backup set in case you come without.

Flowers: Seasonal flowers from the garden or produce from the veg patch

are perfect. Let florists know it is for a natural burial, so no plastic, Oasis foam or wire, please. If this type of flower arrangement is brought in error, it should be taken away at the end of the event.

Please let the custodian know if a posy of flowers is to be left on the grave. TIP - Bring a basket of petals from the garden to scatter into

the grave.



Items in the grave: Additional cremated remains can be included the grave, even

those of a pet; please include details on the application form. You can also include natural tributes e.g. a wooden boat, sea shells; a sealed museum jar with significant pieces, or other inert objects.

After the funeral: We will issue a certificate of interment, by email, with the precise

grave location details. This will be in pdf format for sharing.

Finding the grave: The certificate of interment will include links to Google Maps, GPS

coordinates and the What3Words address of the grave. The

What3Words mobile app is an easy way to navigate to the grave. If

there is ever concern, we can flag the spot.

Memorials: To keep the land sustainable for the future as woodland,

individual graves are not marked. Instead, slate plaques inscribed with the names and dates are mounted with the others between the upright timbers of the memorial panels (on the left as you enter). Memorial rights to display a plaque are granted for 25 years (renewable). The memorial can be ordered on the Interment

Form or a separate application form is available here.

Plants and trees: Native tree planting at the natural burial ground will create a new

area of woodland, improving biodiversity and encouraging wildlife to visit. No individual trees are planted as memorials. Other burial grounds which do are much more like parks or gardens. We aim to create a natural, sustainable woodland. To protect wildlife and bereaved families from unwanted change, nothing should be planted and no seeds should be scattered without our consent.

Further Information

Baby & infant funerals: England has a scheme in place, whereby no fees should be

charged for the burial of a child or person under the age of 18,

which we support.

Direct burials: A direct /simple natural burial can be arranged for families who

do not wish to attend the burial. Full grave location details will be

provided on the burial certificate.

Maintenance: The burial ground is maintained as a new woodland plantation,

with paths mown through the trees. Sheep may be brought in to graze the lower half of the field, but will not be allowed to graze

around the graves.

Long term security: Use of the land is restricted to natural burials by covenants

contained in its 99-year lease. In the future, the land will become

a thriving mature native woodland.
