In the peace of the wildthings

Delliefure natural burial ground's beauty is typical of the Strathspey area of the Cairngorms National Park in which it lies.

The sweeping burial ground is flanked on each side by silver birch woodland. At the far end, the glade opens up to reveal the superb river Spey.

Here you may see buzzards wheeling overhead, while ospreys and otters hunt the flowing river, famous for its salmon and sea trout fishing. On land, the lichen-crusted silver birch woodland is important habitat for deer, red squirrels and pine martens.

It is a place of escape; somewhere quiet to take one step at a time, close to wildlife, with your memories, and view the changes through the seasons.

How it works

A natural burial is the most ecological funeral option, a thoughtful legacy for future generations. The burial ground will remain a beautiful sweeping meadow surrounded by trees.

In advance

- Visit the burial ground and spend time there getting to know it and deciding whether it's right for you.
- Complete an online application form, or download an application form from our website, or phone us and we'll send you an information pack.
- Pre-purchase at today's rate. Options available to pay by standing order.

Practicalities

We recommend stout footwear as the ground is uneven. A foldable chair is a good idea for those who find it difficult to stand and remember, there's no such thing as bad weather, just the wrong sort of clothes...

When planning a funeral

- Complete an online application form or download an interment form to let us know your plans for the day so that we can help you achieve your wishes.
- Make the arrangements yourself or ask your funeral director to do this for you.
- Book the date and time with us. Burials may take place 10am-3pm and at weekends by special arrangement.

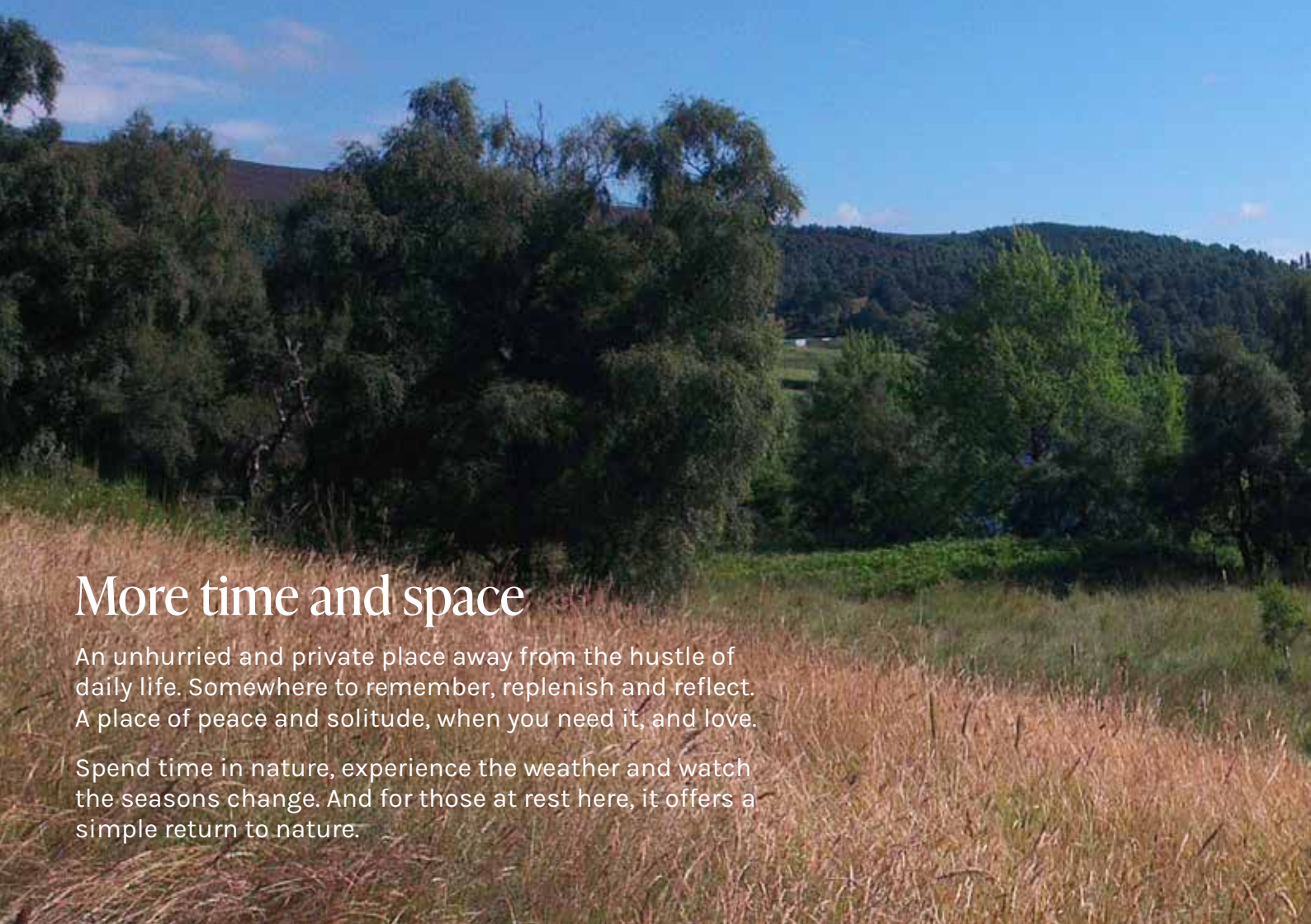

Duncan would be delighted to meet you there, walk you round, help you decide which area to choose and talk about what others have done that works well. He will also be there on the day of the burial to greet you.

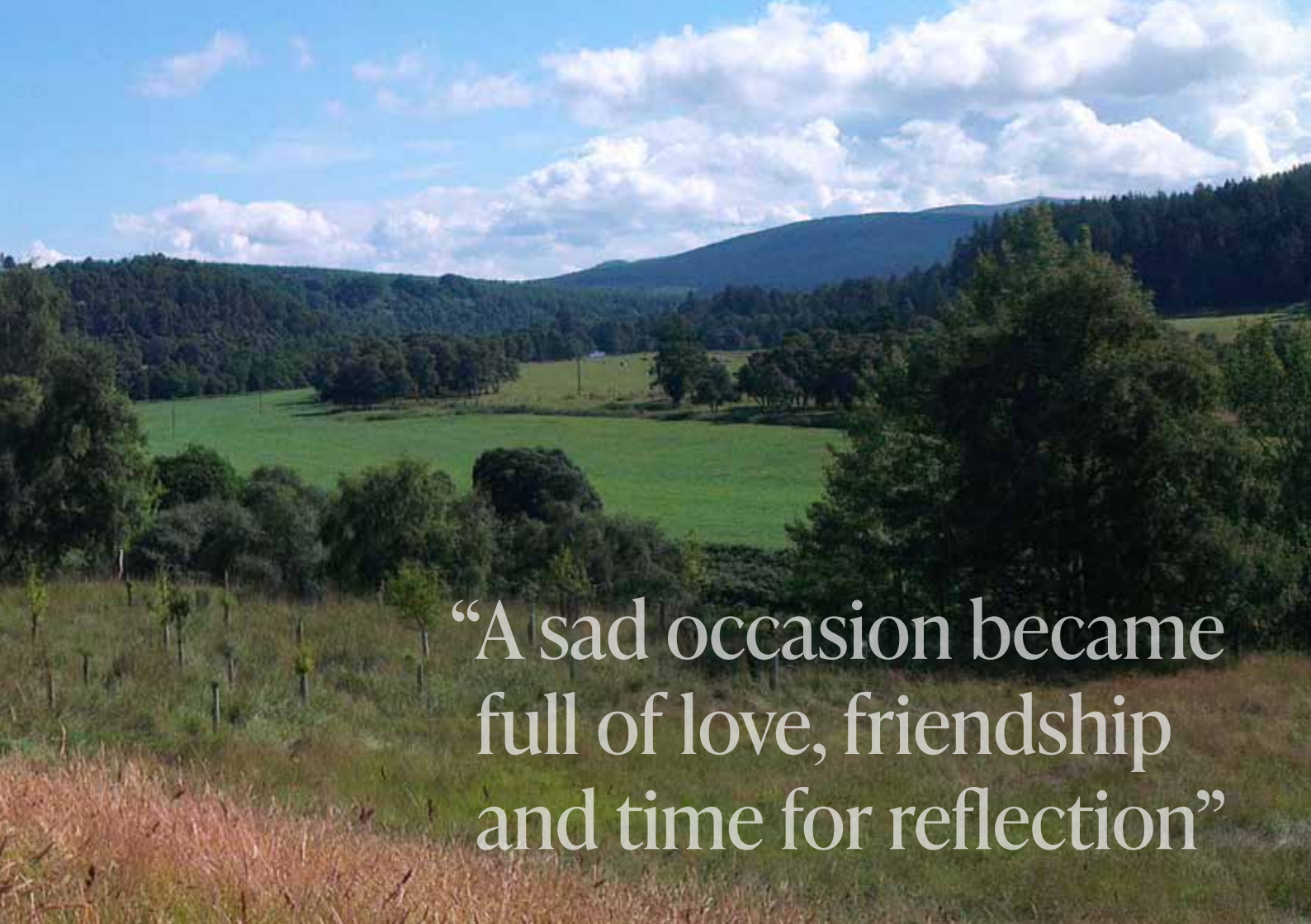

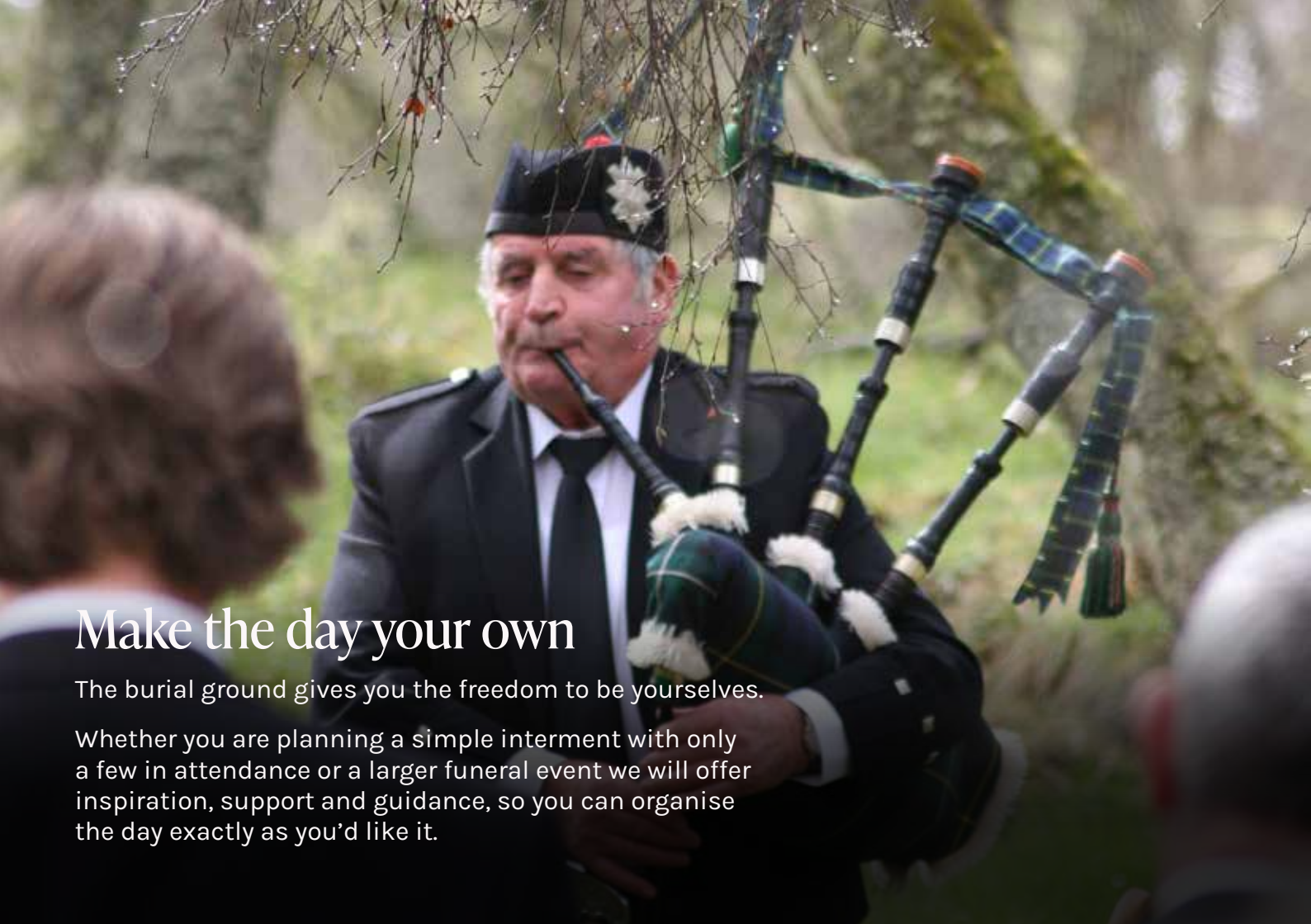
More time and space

Make the day your own

The burial ground gives you the freedom to be yourselves.

Whether you are planning a simple interment with only a few in attendance or a larger funeral event we will offer inspiration, support and guidance, so you can organise the day exactly as you'd like it.



Flowers

Consider using flowers from your garden, or a friend's, or produce from the veg patch to create a hand-tied bouquet. Ask florists to use these or locally grown flowers. No plastic, Oasis foam or wire, please.

Think about scattering petals from a basket or single stems into the grave.



Pets

Dogs offer comfort and companionship, especially at funerals. Dogs on leads are welcome at the burial ground.

A pet's ashes may be included in its owner's grave at the time of interment. Or we have a dedicated area for pet burials at the burial ground.



Memorial plaques

It's important to commemorate the names of the dead and when they lived. Unlike a conventional cemetery, there will not be rows of memorial stones, vases of flowers or mementos placed on each grave.

Instead, inside the burial ground sits a solid chestnut-framed memorial panel where Caithness slate plaques are mounted. Each plaque is inscribed with the name, year of birth and year of death of those buried here. Alternatively, you can purchase the right to place a memorial stone in the woodland. Duncan, the custodian can advise you on the types of stones permitted.



Finding the spot

Graves are carefully mapped and their exact GPS locations and What3Words addresses are recorded and shared with you so that you'll know where to visit.

If you struggle with any of these, don't worry, get in touch with us, and we can arrange to flag the spot for your next visit.

Think about what's important when planning your funeral...

For example:

- Don't waste money on what doesn't matter
- Get it done quickly - within a week if possible
- Don't mess around with dressing me in clothes, just keep me decent
- I do not want to be embalmed - it's a gruesome, poisonous and invasive process
- Make sure the coffin isn't lined with plastic, I don't want to be shrink-wrapped. Use layers of newspaper and cotton calico instead.
- I'd like a natural burial in a peaceful, natural spot in a simple wooden box with rope handles or a big canvas body bag on a board
- Put a piece of my pottery in with me and my transistor radio tuned to Radio 4
- Fill the bottom of the grave with a deep layer of leaf-mould, compost or grass cuttings
- Take me in the van - use their trolley and put me onto the putlogs across the grave
- Keep it small, keep it simple, and keep it real - take the dogs
- Say a few words, read a favourite poem or two and sing Calon Lan
- Lower me in, leave me the crossword for something to do and raise a glass to say goodbye (sherry seems a good choice)
- Look after yourselves and be good to each other.
