Peaceful and Beautiful

The meadow at Aylesbury is rich in natural beauty. A special place to spend time listening to the skylark's song amid the expansive skies and sweeping vales, taking in the fine views of the Chiltern Hills and beyond.

As you enter, we have a beautiful pond to offer encouragement to wildlife and wildflowers. This calming corner is also home to our memorial panel, with slate plaques that commemorate those buried in the meadow.

Burials at Aylesbury Vale are simple, using only natural materials and leaving the lightest of footprints in the picturesque Buckinghamshire countryside.

Ashes can also be laid to rest at the meadow, nestled among vibrant wildflowers and grasses, local wildlife and grazing sheep.

In memory of Dorothy Brock

This meadow celebrates the vision of Dorothy Brock, whose family has farmed the land for five generations. Dorothy chose to rest here in the landscape she loved and opened Aylesbury Vale to share that possibility with others. The burial meadow is now owned and managed by Dorothy's daughter, Sally Whitworth.

Our custodian at Aylesbury Vale is Sally Whitworth. Sally and her husband Craig are actively involved in farming the land, sowing wildflowers and planting trees. They and Sally's cousin Howard jointly look after the burial ground, and will be there to meet families and friends to help with parking and questions on the day of a funeral.

How it works

A natural burial is the most ecological funeral option, a thoughtful legacy for future generations. The meadow will remain as it is now, permanent pasture - preserving its authentic, agricultural character.

In advance

- Visit Aylesbury Vale Natural Burial Meadow and spend time there getting a feel for whether it's right for you.
- Apply online or download an application form from our website, or phone us and we can send you an information pack via post.
- Pre-purchase at today's rate. Options available to pay by standing order.

Practicalities

We recommend sturdy footwear for walking in the Meadow. A foldable chair is a good idea for those who find it difficult to stand and please dress appropriately for the weather. We also have composting toilet facilities on site in the car park.

When planning a funeral

- Complete an application form to let us know your plans for the day so that we can help you deliver your wishes.
- Make the arrangements yourself or ask your funeral director to do this for you.
- Book the date and time with us. Burials can take place at anytime during the day on weekdays and even on Saturdays by arrangement.



Simple, natural and beautiful

The concept behind natural burial is one of giving back to nature. The body is returned to the earth in a biodegradable coffin, wearing only natural materials, without toxic preservative treatment and at a shallower depth, to encourage transformation by nature in the living layer of the soil.





Make the day your own

The meadow gives you the freedom to be yourselves. Whether you are planning a simple interment with only a few in attendance or a larger funeral event we will offer inspiration, support and guidance, so you can organise the day exactly as you'd like it.

Choose the best format, music ceremony and style to suit the person who has died. You could celebrate with an open-air picnic; wear bright colours or a favourite team's strip; arrive by motorbike or horse and carriage. You have the time and space to do it your way.



Flowers

Consider using flowers from your garden, or a friend's, or fresh produce from the veg patch to create a hand-tied bouquet. Ask florists to use these or locally grown flowers. No plastic, Oasis foam or wire, please.

Think about scattering petals from a basket or single stems into the grave.



Pets

Dogs offer comfort and companionship, especially at funerals. We know that they help relieve anxiety and stress. They help children who are grieving and dealing with all the emotions that are brought up at funerals.

Dogs on leads are welcome at the burial meadow.



Memorials

Slate memorial plaques engraved with names and dates commemorate people buried in the meadow.

Rights to display a plaque are granted for a period of 25 years after which they can be renewed.

We also offer a limited number of places where trees can be planted or dedicated to someone's memory within Aylesbury Vale.

Finding the spot

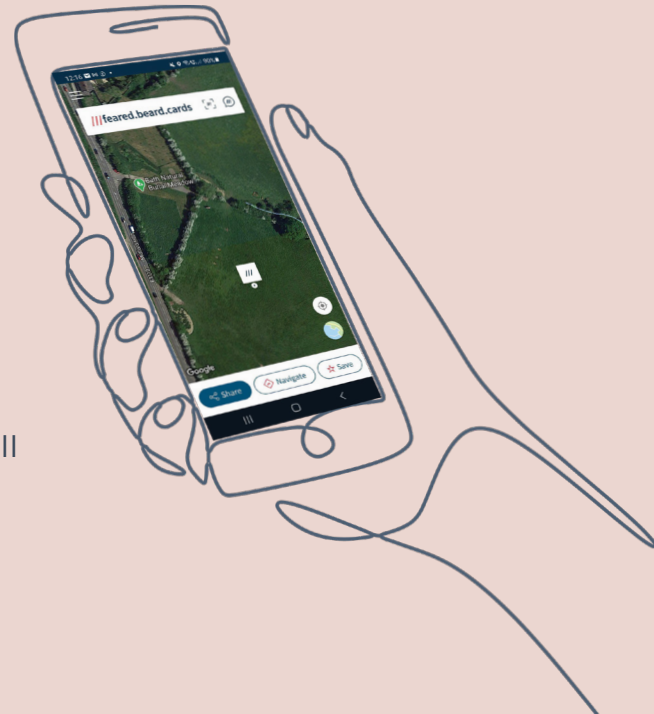
To preserve the natural landscape, graves do not feature headstones, grave-markers or surrounds; instead, they are carefully mapped and their locations are recorded and shared with you so that you'll know where to visit.

Please note that burial law requires us to maintain a public register recording the date of burial, full name, age, address and grave number of the deceased.

Terms & Conditions

Your Rights of Burial

Your Selected Rights of Burial give you the right to have remains interred in your chosen area of the burial ground. They do not confer land ownership, cannot be sold or transferred without our written consent, and remain personal to you. Rights must be exercised within 50 years of purchase.

Payment and Certificate

Your Certificate will be issued once payment is received in full. Full payment is required at least two working days before the funeral date. The Certificate (and any duplicates) must be surrendered to us before burial can take place.

Cancellation and Refunds

Refunds are available for five years from the date of full payment, as follows: Within 14 days: full refund | 15 days to 3 months: 90% refund | 3 months to 1 year: 75% refund | 1 year to 5 years: 50% refund. No refund is available after five years, or after the death of the Nominee. To cancel, notify us in writing and return the Certificate.

Transfers

Rights may be transferred to a new Nominee before burial, subject to our written consent and a fee of £200 per right. The original purchase date is retained for any future refund calculation.

Conditions of Burial

Only biodegradable coffins, urns or shrouds from sustainable sources may be used. Embalmed remains cannot be interred. We must receive at least three clear working days’ notice before interment, along with the completed Interment Form, Certificate, and all relevant fees. No memorials, markers or plantings are permitted unless specifically agreed by us.

Site Management

The burial ground is managed primarily for wildlife and agriculture. We retain sole discretion over planting, landscaping and maintenance. Only the Nominated Grave Digger may excavate graves. Grave excavation costs are not included in the purchase price.

Availability

In the event that ground conditions or other circumstances make your selected area unavailable, we will offer reasonable alternatives. If alternatives are not accepted, a full refund will be issued within 28 days.

Your Responsibilities

You and your Representatives are responsible for complying with all relevant legislation and our reasonable site instructions, and for the conduct of all persons attending the burial ground with your consent.

Access	The main entrance gate code is 1844, this is given to families with relatives there. The pedestrian gate into the meadow is not locked.
Description	The meadow is typical of the Aylesbury Vale area in Buckinghamshire - a wide open rural landscape with big skies. Unhurried, tranquil and private, it offers something gentler. A place of escape, away from it all.
Ethos	Keep things simple, natural and sustainable. Beautiful countryside preserved for future generations.
On-site facilities	Car park, wildlife area with pond and memorial plaque panel. We have composting toilet facilities in the car park for use at funerals. No rooms, chapels or mortuary facilities on site.

Procedures

Prices and forms	A price list and all forms are available on the website: www.leedam.com/locations/aylesbury-vale/forms-and-prices
Provisional booking	Call 01600 716438 to make a provisional funeral booking, after the death has been certified, and let us know the requested date, name of the deceased, your own contact details and any prior purchase information.
Confirmation	We will check the calendar to make sure the date is available, then contact the gravedigger and custodian to make sure they are also available before confirming the booking.
Submit forms	Complete an online application form, or download a PDF from the website and at least three days before the event email it to aylesbury@leedam.co.uk with a scanned copy of the Coroner's Order of Burial or a Registrar's Certificate (or cremation certificate for an ashes interment).
Payments	We will send you invoices and payment is made by bank transfer. We required payment no less than two days before the event. The gravedigger is paid separately, and will also require payment before the event. We will send you a receipt and confirm that everything is OK.
Embalming	Embalming is not permitted. Embalming fills the body with toxic chemicals, which we do not wish to introduce into the soil. We would only accept embalmed remains in exceptional circumstances, e.g. repatriation.
Choosing a plot	The burial ground is divided into two areas with different prices: Meadow and Owlswick End. Arrange a family visit to the burial ground with the Custodian (07736 526941) to choose an area and be shown the next available plot.
Double plots	Plots are single depth. Double plots are arranged side by side. The second plot can be paid for in full or costs can be spread over 10 or 20 months by setting up a monthly standing order (extra admin charge applies). If undecided, we can provisionally reserve it for 1 year, after which it may be offered to others.
Coffins etc	Choose an eco-coffin, casket or shroud. All materials, including linings and clothing, should be natural and biodegradable. No veneered MDF or chipboard, please. Standard nameplates are OK or a handwritten card label with the deceased's name and dates. <i>TIP - Use calico canvas instead of polythene Crem Film.</i>

Coffin size	Please measure and include the true maximum external dimensions of the coffin on the Interment Forms. If in doubt please call us.
Grave digging	Our nominated gravedigger will prepare the grave ready for your arrival. Graves are single depth 1.3m; double plots are arranged side by side. Payment is made directly to the grave digger. We will send you a pro forma invoice with instructions before the funeral.
On the day	<p>There is usually only one burial on the day and time is not limited. The Custodian will be there to meet and direct you.</p> <p>The vehicular gate into the meadow will be open for the hearse, limousine and family mourners with limited mobility who display the priority parking sign in the windscreen. More info: www.leedam.com/advice/disabled-access <i>TIP - Estate cars are popular with families instead of the formal hearse.</i></p>
Dogs and pets	Dogs offer comfort and companionship, especially at funerals. Dogs on leads are welcome at the burial meadow.
Music	There is no electrical power supply in the burial ground. Make sure that battery-powered speakers are powerful enough to deliver good sound quality. Live, acoustic music is always beautiful.
What to wear	Wellies/hiking shoes (not high-heels); warm, windproof clothes. <i>TIP - Bring folding chairs, scarves, hats and blankets for the elderly.</i>
Carrying the coffin	The ground is uneven, so it is recommended to carry the coffin underarm rather than on shoulders, feet first. Set up trestles at regular resting points if the carry distance is long.
Webbing	Our gravedigger supplies sanitised webbing, so there is no need to bring your own.
Flowers	Seasonal flowers from the garden or produce from the veg patch are perfect. Please let florists know it is for a natural burial, so no plastic, Oasis foam or wire. Arrangements should be taken away at the end of the event. Please let the custodian know if a posy of flowers is to be left on the grave. <i>TIP - Bring a basket of petals from the garden to scatter into the grave.</i>
Items in the grave	Additional ashes can be included in the grave, please include details on the application form. You can also include natural tributes e.g. wooden boat, sea shells; a sealed museum jar with significant pieces, or other inert objects.

After the funeral	We will issue a certificate of interment, by email, with the precise grave location details. This will be in pdf format for sharing.
Finding the grave	The certificate of interment will include links to Google Maps, GPS coordinates and the What3Words address of the grave. The What3Words mobile app is an easy way to navigate to the grave. If there is any concern, we can flag the spot.
Memorials	Slate plaques inscribed with the names and dates are mounted between the upright timbers of the timber memorial panel. Memorial rights are granted for 25 years (renewable). Tree planting is available in the copse area next to the car park if families would like to plant a tree in memory of someone buried at the burial ground. Plants and trees	Opportunities exist to plant new trees in the margins of the meadow, pond and in the copse. Please discuss this with the custodian. In order to conserve the natural habitat and protect bereaved families nothing should be planted and no seeds should be scattered without our consent.

Further Information

Baby & infant funerals	England has a scheme in place, which we support, whereby no fees should be charged for the burial of a child or person under the age of 18 (but over the age of 24 weeks). Details: https://leedam.com/advice/childrens-funerals/
Direct burials	A direct/simple natural burial can be arranged for families who do not wish to attend the burial. Full grave location details will be provided on the burial certificate.
Burial ground rules	Outlined in full here - www.leedam.com/rules-and-regulations
Maintenance	The burial ground is maintained as agricultural grassland. it will be mown periodically and paths will be cut. Sheep may be brought in to graze the land and when they do, be careful where you tread.
Long term security	The land has planning consent for use as a natural burial ground combined with agriculture. This gives it a high level of protection. There is no real chance of the land being redeveloped at any time in the future - read more here: www.leedam.com/future-security
